

FEEDING FAMILIES

Partner Agency Program: A cornerstone of our efforts, this program partners with a vast network of agencies to distribute food across Charlotte, Collier, Glades, Hendry, and Lee counties. Through strategic food procurement and transportation, we've supplied approximately 70% of our partners' food inventories. reaching those in need efficiently and effectively.

Fulfill Mobile Pantry Program: Adapting to the pandemic's challenges, we've shifted between farmers' market-style distributions and drive-thru models to ensure no family goes hungry. This program has been a lifeline for many, offering a variety of nutritious foods directly to communities in high need.

FEEDING CHILDREN

In-School Pantry Program: In partnership with Feeding America, this program places food pantries inside schools, making it easier for students and their families to access the food they need in a familiar and safe environment. By providing shelf-stable and fresh foods, we're ensuring children have the nutrition they need to thrive.

Harry's Helpings Program: Tailored for childcare and afterschool settings, this program delivers food kits packed with nutritious meals, addressing hunger in spaces where traditional food pantries are not feasible.

FEEDING SENIORS

Care and Share Senior Feeding Program: Focused on supporting low-income seniors, this program provides monthly food kits containing balanced, easy-to-prepare meals, supplemented with fresh produce when possible. Partnering with senior housing sites, we've ensured that vulnerable seniors have access to the nutritious food they deserve.

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP): A federal initiative that we've proudly implemented in Glades and Hendry counties, offering monthly nutritious food boxes to eligible seniors, aiding in their health and well-being.
